SUPPORTING INFORMATION;

a. Rational: Health 405 "Alcoholism and Alcohol Education" was inadvertently dropped from the undergraduate catalog effective Fall 2006 as a course that hadn't been offered in four years. However, it was scheduled and taught during the summer of 2006, which falls within the 4 year period of offering for the course.

b. Relationship to other courses/programs: This course has been a part of the health curriculum for over 20 years. It serves as a course in the existing undergraduate minor in Adolescent Health which is coordinated by the Health and Safety Program Academic area in ITHES, the course is also selected as an upper-level elective for undergraduate students.

c. Format: Standard classroom lecture, on-campus.

d. Impact: None. The course is already scheduled to be taught in summer 2006. In the future it is scheduled to be offered in the spring or summer by full time faculty in the health education area. The scheduling of the course will be included in the regular faculty load of existing Health Education faculty.
