

Faculty Spotlight! Ashley Downs



Hi everyone! I'm so excited to have joined the department as a faculty lecturer and Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) Workforce Development Liaison. I am currently teaching two courses in the undergraduate public health program: PUBH 202, introductory epidemiology, and PUBH 489, the practice experience course. Teaching is a passion of mine, and I feel lucky to work with students in my role here at UTK. In addition to the two classes I teach, I also work for TDH aiding in workforce development projects, programs, and initiatives, with the goal of bolstering the public health workforce here in Tennessee. One of TDH's projects I am contributing to is our trauma-informed workforce initiative to promote the retention of the skilled public health professionals working at TDH.

Before moving to Tennessee, I spent most of my life in Pennsylvania and received my MPH from the University of Pennsylvania. Prior to joining UTK, I worked in research for Children's Hospital of Philadelphia's (CHOP) Center for Injury Research and Prevention. My work there centered on traffic safety, specifically establishing the scientific foundation related to neurodivergence (Autism and ADHD) and driving. One of my favorite experiences was getting to share my team's preliminary data from our naturalistic driving study with Autistic teens and young adults at the Society for Advancement of Violence and Injury Research national conference. Traffic safety remains one of my top public health interests! My other interests include weight-inclusive frameworks in healthcare, anti-fat bias, LGBTQIA+ health, and harm reduction. Faculty Being Fabulous!

Congrats to Dr. Laurie L. Meschke who will be a co-PI on *Strengthening Behavioral Health in Underserved Communities with Science-Driven Socially Informed Smart and Connected Healthcare Delivery Tools*, a project funded by the National Science Foundation. The interdisciplinary research team, lead by Dr. Zhenbo Wang of Mechanical, Aerospace, and Biomedical Engineering, will collaborate to use drones to deliver medical supplies to rural Appalachia. Laurie will be responsible for evaluating community engagement, usability of the phone app, and the impact on local behavioral health. The 4-year project will start in January 2025.
